


# Training on Integrated Management of Childhood Illness and Essential New Born Care


Training healthcare workers on supporting Mums to breastfeed their newborn babies with proper guidance and counselling; learning clinical skills as part of integrated management of childhood illness.

#### Newness to intellectual property diplomacy

 Shifting focus from commercially-oriented to patient-centred health diplomacy

#### Training on global health diplomacy

- Health officers to gain skills on influencing another party in international forum
- Health officers able to promote patients' interests
